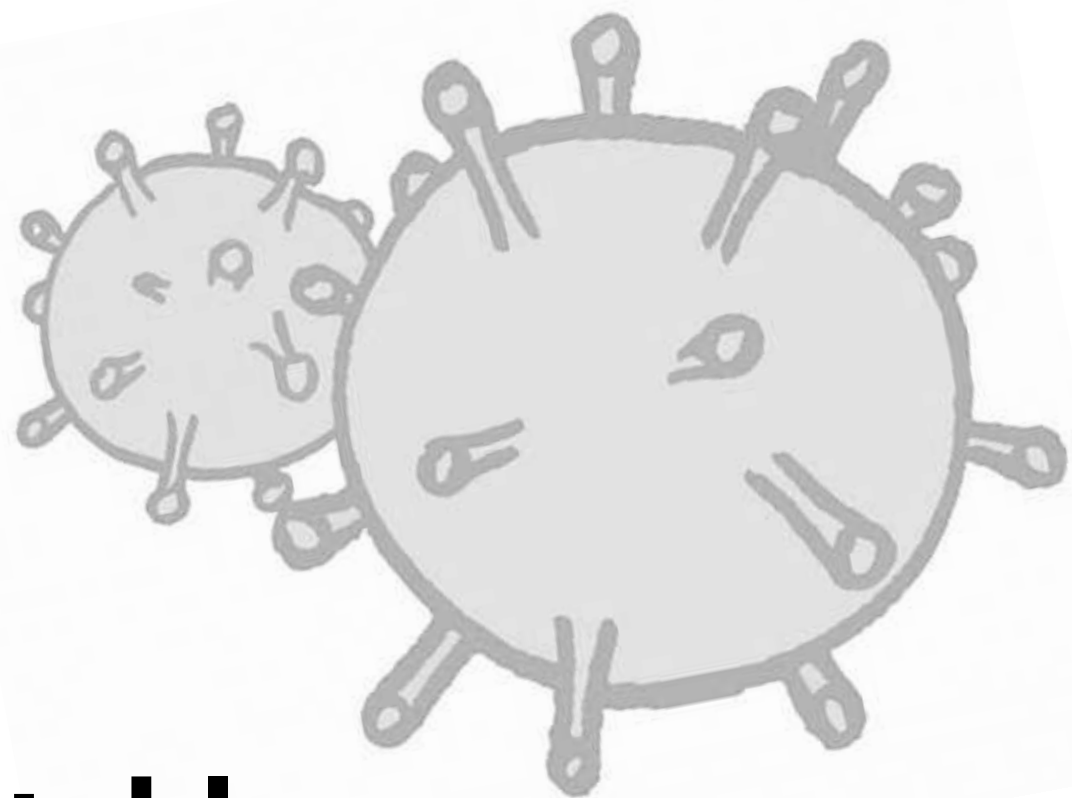


SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS (STI)



Treatable

Through oral, anal, vaginal sex, and sharing blood:

- HIV
- Hepatitis B

Through oral, anal, and vaginal sex, and skin-to-skin contact:

- Genital Herpes
- Genital Warts

STI Prevention

- Don't have sex.
- Use condoms and sex dams
- Get tested every 6 months, or with each new partner

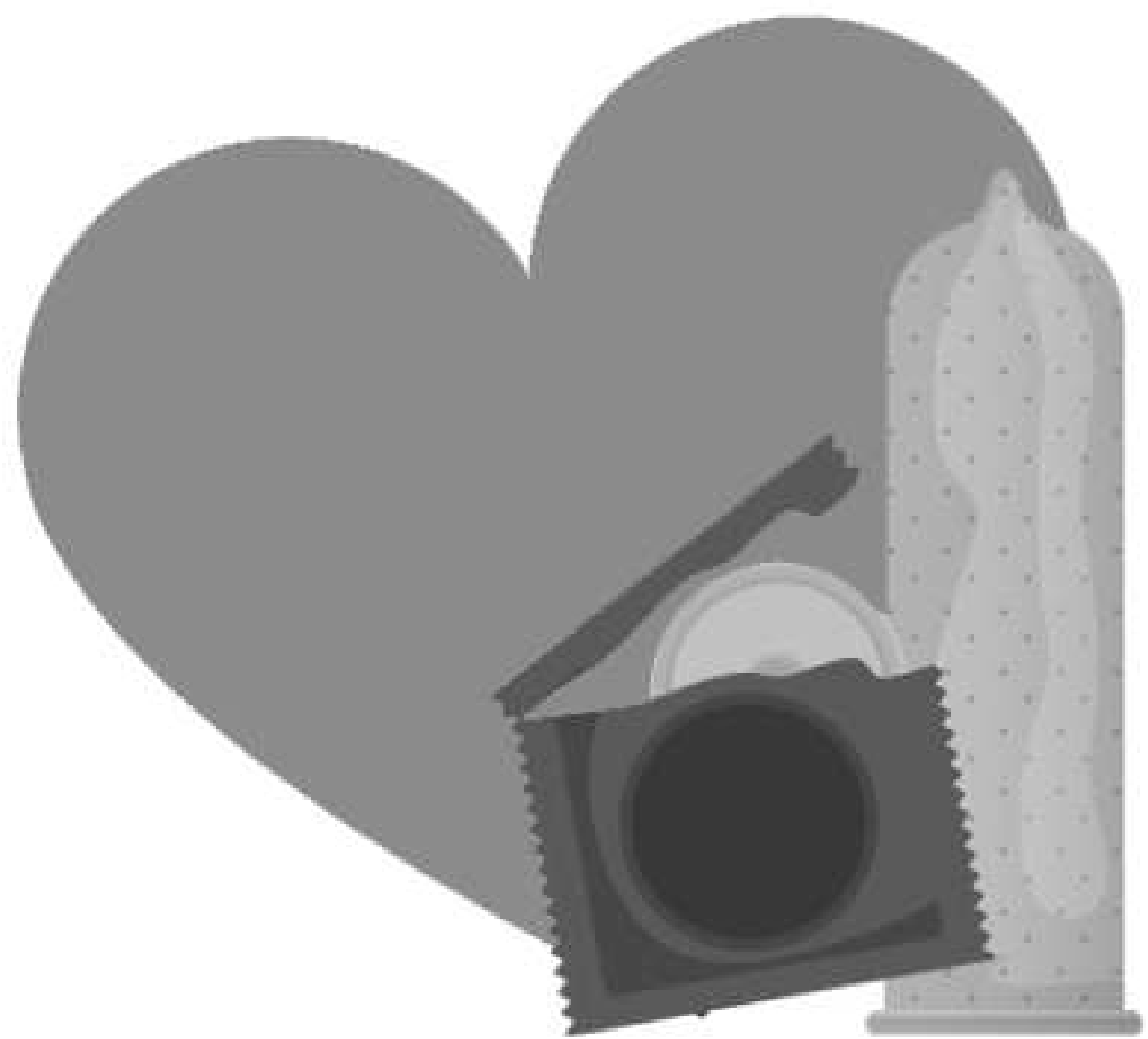
Curable

Through oral, anal, and vaginal sex:

- Chlamydia
- Gonorrhea
- Trichomoniasis
- Hepatitis C

Through oral, anal, and vaginal sex, and skin-to-skin contact:

- Pubic Lice
- Syphilis



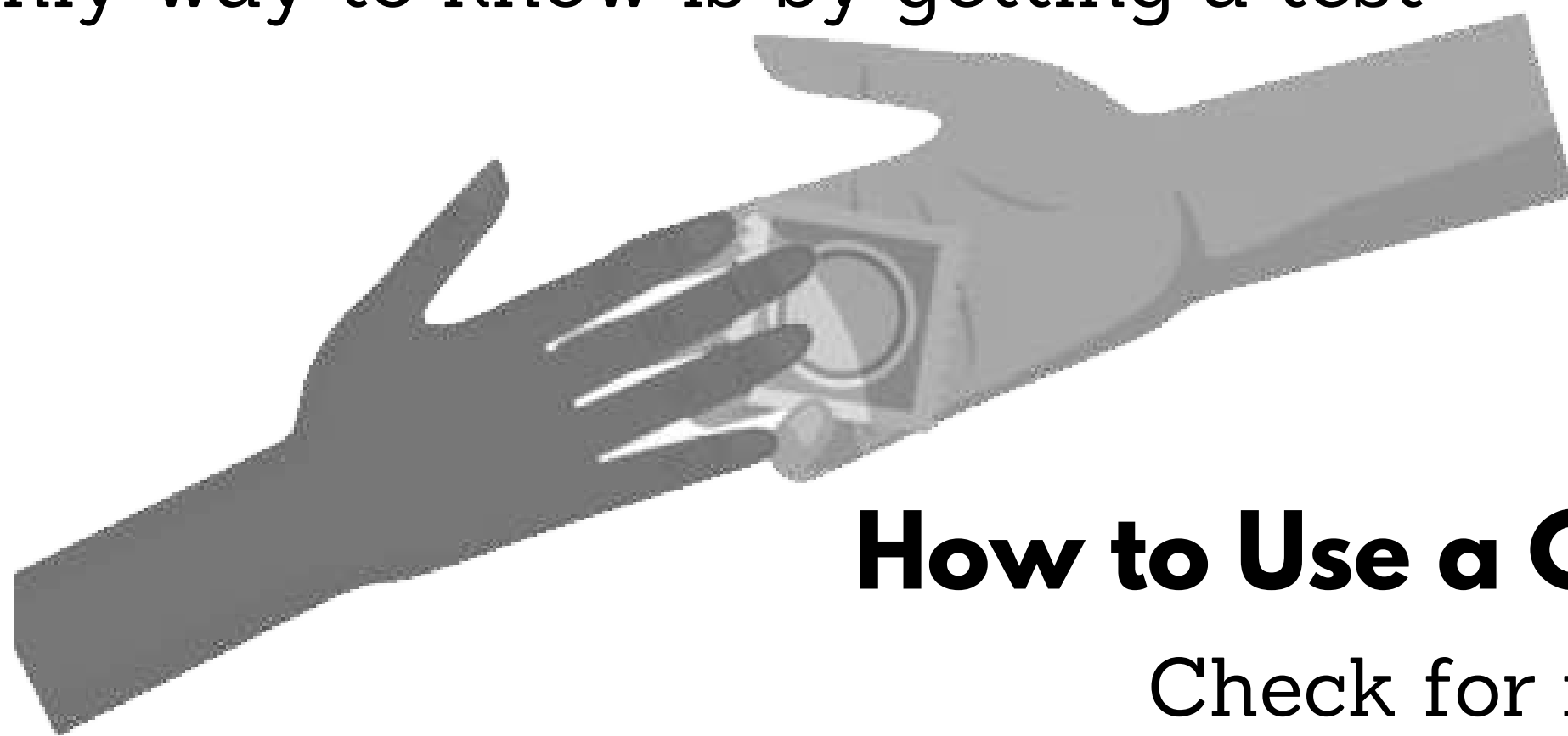
How do you know if you have an STI?

- S**kin Changes: Lump, bump, rash, or sore
- I**rritation: Hurts to pee or feel like peeing but nothing comes out
- G**enital Itching: Ongoing itching in the pubic area
- N**oticeable Pelvic Pain: Pain around lower back/stomach
- S**ex Organ Discharge: Fluids coming out of vagina, penis, or anus that are different for you.

There are often no signs of an STI
The only way to know is by getting a test

How to Use a Condom

- Check for rips/holes
- Check the expiration date
- Open and unroll 1 notch
- Hold the tip with a 3-finger pinch
- Roll down with your other hand

What to Expect at an STI test

- Pee in a cup
- Blood sample
- Sometimes a swab of the mouth, or anus
